Starbuck wins Mt. Evans race

Don Starbuck of Golden turned in a record-breaking performance Sunday in winning the Denver Central YMCA Mt. Evans 14.2 mile run.

Starbuck, a 27-year-old Vietnam veteran, covered the uphill climb in 1 hour, 58 minutes and 35 seconds, breaking the old mark of Zephyr Isley of Denver, who ran the course in 2:06:15 last year. Isley finished fifth Sunday.

David Quinn of Steamboat Springs was second in 1:59:02 and Lee Courkamp, Arvada West High School track coach, was third in the 53-runner field in 2:02:40.

Fourteen-year-old Don Fowler was the youngest runner. Gale Dobski, the lone woman competitor, reached the nine-mile mark, but dropped out at that point.
